Meeting Summary

The board meeting was called to order at 11:00 AM.

Budget/Expenditures

As of February 28, 2025, year-to-date expenditures for the Northeast Iowa STEM Hub totaled approximately \$339,834, representing about 46% of the overall fiscal year 2025 budget.

IOWA STEM Teacher Award

The Northeast Iowa STEM Teacher Award was presented to Dan Kuchera of Clarksville High School. The STEM Hub recognized Mr. Kuchera with an initial presentation at the high school on January 13. A formal award ceremony will take place in February during STEM Day at the Capitol.

Scale-Up Programs

The 2025-26 Scale-Up application closed March 4. The Northeast STEM region received 111 applications (602 applications statewide) representing 226 educators and 13,389 students. Total request for the region was approximately \$710,000. According to the STEM Council, the 2025-2026 appropriation for the Northeast Region is budgeted at approximately \$550,000 toward Scale-Up programming and STEM festivals.

A breakdown was provided outlining the number of applications submitted by program, organization type (Public School, Private School, Home School, and Informal), and the population served. Highlights include:

- A total of 81 school buildings or organizations were represented in the application pool.
- 12 organizations (14.8%) were first-time applicants.
- 75 applications were submitted by organizations classified as rural.
- 60 applications were received from public schools.
- 17 applications came from organizations offering informal learning opportunities.

Jeff thanked the Board members for evaluating applications. The Board reviewed and discussed the applications for each Scale-Up program. Key considerations included whether the applicant was a first-time participant, the geographic distribution of awards across the region, the number of awards granted to individual school buildings or organizations, the number of awards per educator, prior participation in the program, whether the application introduced a new program or expanded an existing one, and the projected number of students impacted.

Following a thorough review, 84 applications—representing 182 educators—were recommended for funding in the Northeast Iowa STEM Region for the 2025–26 academic year.
